About the Falsified Medicines Directive (FMD)

- FMD comes into effect across the UK and the rest of Europe on 9th February 2019. Pharmacies will need to verify medicines are legitimate by scanning and checking them against the medicines verification system (SecurMed UK) and then decommission them (removing them from the system) when they are supplied to the patient.
- FMD aims to prevent the supply of falsified medicines i.e. medicines that may contain the wrong active ingredients, or the wrong amount of the correct active ingredients.
- Medicines placed on the market from 9th February will feature an Anti-Tampering Device (ATD) and a Unique Identifier (UI). (Manufacturers will have six months from the date of approval of variation to exhaust their 'old' stock and have 'new' stock ready for the market with the ADT and UI.)
- Community pharmacies need to be compliant with the new rules this means registering with SecurMed UK, checking your IT systems are compliant, and changing SOPs and processes.
